



## Reacceptance conditions

### Products specification of the used papersacks to be taken over:

As of: October 2000

- 1) The papersacks are to be delivered, separated into the groups of contents
  - a) building materials
  - b) food- and fodder-products
  - c) chemical products
  - d) papersacks with aluminium contentand have to be marked accordingly.

metal, glass, rubber, rocks, wood, textiles nor other packaging materials and other wastepapers such as paper, cardboard packaging, aluminium laminated synthetic substances, and cardboard-compound materials for liquid food products.

Foils which are not a structural part of the papersacks are also interfering substances.
- 2) The content group "chemical products" consists of eight subgroups. These are:
  - Group 1): inorganic compounds with an alkaline reaction
  - Group 2): inorganic compounds reacting acidically
  - Group 3): inorganic inert compounds
  - Group 4): organic, non-reactive compounds towards each other
  - Group 5): organic polymer-compounds except for PVC
  - Group 6): PVC
  - Group 7): soot
  - Group 8): colour-pigments

The subgroups 1 to 6 and 7 + 8 may be combined.

The portion of other packaging materials and wastepapers added-up may not exceed 5%.
- 3) The papersacks must be dry and thoroughly freed from dust by hand (dust free), accumulations of content leftovers on the inside and outside may not be. The content leftovers may not exceed 20% of the empty papersack weight (tare).

The parties of this contract agree that the specification "dry" in this contract means sacks with a remaining moisture of less than 30%.
- 4) The material may not contain interfering substances and any alien materials such as
- 5) Paper sacks or contractual packaging containing harmful substances, as stipulated in §7 of the Packaging Ordinance as well as packaging labels with the symbol for hazardous substances and dangerous goods may not be delivered. These packaging, except for paper sacks of cement or lime contents and accompanying terms, are covered by the special REPASACK take-back system for packaging of harmful substances.
- 6) Excluded from labelling with the REPASACK-ideographic writing are papersacks which contain bitumenpaper, wax- or paraffinpaper, synthetic fabrics, fleece or jute combinations. Also excluded are sacks made out of waterresistant papers, if these portions of this paperfraction exceed 15%.

The bales may not be packaged in shrinking- or stretching foil. The bales must each have easily visible and durable labelling showing the sender and the content group. Papersacks from the chemical industry must have the numbers of the combined subgroups clearly visible. The freight papers must indicate the exact net-weight and the sender.
